### **Motorola Educator-of-the-Year-Award: Marilyn Barger, Hillsborough Community College, Named as 2004 Recipient**



The Motorola Educator-of-the-Year Award will be presented at the Semiconductors, Automated Manufacturing, Electronics – Training and Education Conference in San Jose, California. This year’s winner is Marilyn Barger, Associate Professor of Manufacturing Engineering Technology, at Hillsborough Community College in Tampa, Florida.

The Educator-of-the-Year Award recognizes a community college educator for outstanding contributions to semiconductor manufacturing technology education. Nominees for the award must have had a demonstrated impact on technology education on both a local and national level.

Barger has been involved in curriculum development for B.S. and A.S. Engineering and Engineering Technology degree programs for over 15 years. She has received funding from the National Science Foundation’s Advanced Technology Education program for several projects including outreach programs for Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) K-12 teachers and students. Barger actively collaborates with researchers at the University of South Florida and others across the U.S. She is a registered professional engineer in Florida and has current research activities in membrane technologies for water treatment.

### **MATEC Industry Recognition Award: Lisa Anderson, SEMI, Named as 2004 Recipient**



The MATEC Industry Recognition Award will be presented at the Semiconductors, Automated Manufacturing and Electronics – Training and Education Conference (SAME-TEC) in San Jose, California. This year's winner is Lisa Anderson, Vice President for Industry Workforce Development at SEMI.

Anderson founded the Workforce Development Institute and the High Tech U program.
